About Bookshare

Bookshare is the world's largest online accessible library of copyrighted content for people with print disabilities. Through its technology initiatives and partnerships, Bookshare seeks to address accessibility issues so that individuals with print disabilities have the same ease of access to print materials as people without disabilities.

Bookshare® membership is for people with print disabilities and is provided **FREE to US** students of any age and schools!

Who qualifies for Bookshare?

- A person who is **blind** or has **low vision** and who is unable to read standard print as long as a competent authority confirms that the person is legally blind or has a significant problem accessing text.
- A person with a **physical disability** who is unable to read standard print as long as a competent authority confirms that the physical disability significantly interferes with reading.
- A person with a **learning disability** such as dyslexia as long as a competent authority confirms that the learning disability significantly interferes with reading.
